UK CAT STRATEGIC ACTIONS

1. Support R&D and pilot scale demonstration of CATS
2. Support the demonstration of CO₂ capture ready Plant
3. Support demonstration of CO₂ Storage
4. Facilitate international collaboration in UK-based CAT development and demonstration projects
5. Examine possible measures to encourage the initial commercial deployment of CCS
6. Facilitate the acquisition and transfer of knowledge/know-how
7. Lead in preparing the national and international regulatory frameworks and market systems
8. Increase public awareness and stimulate an informed debate on the role of CATs
9. Develop and maintain a route map for the development of CATs in the UK

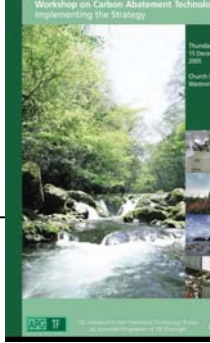
